MEETING MINUTES DCAT GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE August 2, 2006

I. CALL TO ORDER:

Dave Langley called the meeting to order at 7:12

II. AGENDA APPROVAL: Approval of the agenda was moved, seconded and approved unanimously.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Approval of the minutes was delayed until the end of the meeting so copies could be made available for the committee.

IV. DCAT SUPERVISOR REPORT:

Craig reported that there was one new hire, Jeff Berlin, an ORHS senior, and the possibility of another, a senior at UNH. He noted the mention of DCAT in an article on local cable access in the publication WIRE. He discussed the hard drive problem which will involve rebuilding pages and other issues. Craig raised the issue of the budget as he had contacted Pete about the figures he had submitted to the town; they included no new requests, maintained current staff levels and equipment. It was decided to add discussion of budget issues to new business on the agenda.

It was moved, seconded and voted to support efforts to promote DCAT at Durham Day as appropriate.
