- 1. The minutes of the 1-10-05 meeting were approved.
- 2. Diana reported on her school paper use research. Oyster River Schools order their paper supplies from SES (Seacoast Educational Services) in Rochester, NH, a company that supplies many schools. SES goes out to bid annually. The bid goes to the paper company with the lowest price. The 2004 bid went to CP Paper in Nashua. Some of this paper came from Brazil. In 2005 the bid went to Savin Corp. in Ohio. Using figures from the OR Schools and estimated pricing for 2005, the additional cost to ORHS for the same 100% post consumer recycled, 100% chlorine free paper that the Town now uses would be \$940 more per year.

Diana has contacted a member of the Lee Recycling Committee and will contact the Chair of the Madbury Town Council. Tracy questioned why SES could not buy recycled paper in bulk. Diana suggested that the extra funds required for the recycled paper may be supplied by savings on lighting costs, i.e. keeping exterior electric lighting off during daylight hours and other procedures. Tracy thought a grant to get started might be helpful. Jessie suggested PSNH and NH DES for possible grant money. Dale will check into grant possibilities. Tracy also suggested running a silent auction to raise money to support the recycled paper initiative.

Diana's plan was agreed upon; to speak to school administrators, school board members and others one on one so no one is surprised by this proposal. The entire committee will probably take part in this effort.

3. The spring newsletter will feature sustainable landscapes and green gardening with the theme of water use running through several articles. Tracy and Merle will collaborate on the feature articles. Jessie will report on the ORHS Environmental Club, the transition to electronic newsletters for some, as well as organize the layout, printing, and mailing procedures. Tracy will report on the spring RENEW program and interview one downtown business. Diana and Merle will also each interview a business. Neal will be attending the February 22nd meeting in Barrington concerning the proposed sewer pipe from the Great Bay area to the ocean. He will report on the pipe in the newsletter. Dale will write up the recent Swap Shop Volunteer Soiree and include some photos. Merle will write up the Did You Know section.
