IMPETUS FOR PROJECT (IE. MANDATED, COUNCIL GOAL, DEPT INITIATIVE, ETC.)

The strategy is to have each marked police vehicle, the primary responding patrol vehicle of the department, to remain on-line for three-years. This is the optimum period where the vehicles are in prime condition and operate 24/7 with reliability.

DESCRIPTION (TO INCLUDE JUSTIFICATION)

This is the first year that all of the marked police vehicles are the Ford Taurus with the V-6 fuel efficient engines. These all-wheel drive vehicles have demonstrated reliability in spite of the harsh conditions they function under. With different vehicle operators, immense idling time and traversing the occasional rough roadway, the Ford Taurus is beginning to sway many who were highly disappointed when the venerable Crown Vic was retired by Ford. The \$31,000 price includes the vehicle purchase, \$4,600 to transfer all equipment from one vehicle to another, and approximately \$1,400 to paint the cruisers.

The Department recommends replacing two (2) cruisers each year. The price is increased following year 2020.

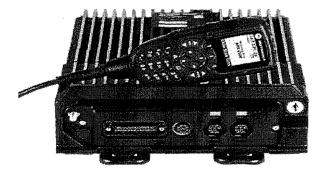
Older vehicles will be evaluated yearly and a determination made as to whether they shall be traded-in or handed down to DPW for use as a pool vehicle within the Town Departments.

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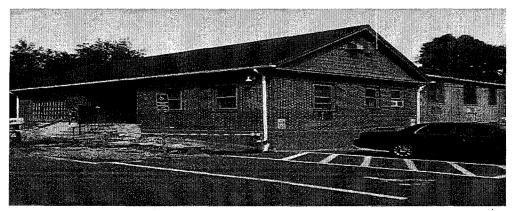

The project impetus is to construct an addition to the existing police facility during a period of increased tax base capacity and ensure that the community has a police facility that will provide service for the next 30 + years without enhancements.

DESCRIPTION (TO INCLUDE JUSTIFICATION)

The 5,600 square foot police facility is an adequate facility that was purchased and renovated in 1997 for \$440,000. Over the years the facility has served the Town well but there are significant deficiencies in the area of building integrity pertaining to windows, air conditioners in each room, antiquated heating plant as well as our ability to retain evidence, records storage and the closet sized woman's locker room. Without engineered drawings the price of an addition is speculative. The goal is to have a complete design portfolio that will be "shovel ready" and allow the Town to determine costs.
