Proposed 2017 Historic District Commission Budget

<u>Historic District Commission - General Supplies.</u> (Historic District Commission budget). The proposed \$5,000 would cover installation of plaques and directional signage, special events, special projects, and other miscellaneous expenses. The HDC believes that it would be very valuable to finally install informational and commemorative plaques at Smith Chapel, the old courthouse, and the Mill Pond dam. This figure would allow us to install one or more plaques depending on cost.

The services we provide are unique to the populations we serve and without these services our clients would have to turn to Welfare Offices and assistance programs of the towns in which they live. AIDS Response Seacoast provides services that assist persons living with HIV/AIDS to maintain an improved quality of life and to prevent new HIV infections. All of the services ARS provides are offered without cost to anyone living with HIV/AIDS in the counties we serve. We serve between 3 and 8 residents of the Town of Durham (due to confidentiality we cannot give exact numbers).

Request was received October 14, 2016 following the finalization of the 2017 Budget Proposal. If the Council wishes to consider their request they are asking for funds in the amount of \$16,000, or whatever amount Durham is able to provide, to offset the increase in Durham charitable care. During the last fiscal year they provided 2,243 hours of care to Durham residents with 87% of the clients unable to pay for the services.

This year the Cross Roads House has served one Durham resident in the fiscal year ended 7/31/16. The level of funding requested is not directly related to the actual services provided to Durham residents. With less than 16% of our shelter operating costs covered by state and federal grants we depend heavily upon municipalities to support our services and maintain our capacity. Over the years the residents of Durham have generously supported Cross Roads House and are one reason we are still able to meet the needs of local people experiencing homelessness.

The Homeless Center of Strafford County provides safe shelter and professional case management to homeless women and families, helping them to achieve self-sufficiency. We offer professional case management for all residents as well as mandatory onsite parenting classes for any resident with a child under the age of 18, mandatory nutrition classes and transportation in and out five days a week as well as referrals to other resources needed on a case by case basis. Although the shelter has not served a Durham resident in the past three years we are requesting the funding in order to remain a viable option if the need arises. If the shelter were not in operation and just one resident was put up in a motel the cost would far outweigh the cost of the funding request and the family would not benefit from case management services provided at the Homeless Center.

The funds will be used to subsidize the health care for the uninsured residents of Durham. In fiscal year 2016 (July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016) we saw 11 uninsured Durham residents in a total of 32 medical visits and 14 uninsured Durham residents for 32 dental visits. The Bureau of Primary Care calculates our cost per visit for dental at \$127 and medical \$133.

Narrative for Column # 5

The request for funding relates to the services provided to the residents of Durham. However, due to the confidential nature of our work as well as the constant flux of children in and out of the child protection system at any given time, we are not at liberty to disclose exact numbers of children served in each town. These children are often relocated multiple times throughout the course of an open case - moving from one foster or group home to another as well as transferring to multiple schools, even in one year. Last year in Strafford County there were 116 children with 36 advocates by their side.

Funds received are directed towards recruiting, screening and training volunteer advocates who give children a voice in court. Children with a CASA volunteer benefit in countless ways - they are more likely to be placed in safe, permanent homes, likely to receive better services and more likely to have fewer placement changes than children without a focused advocate.

Effective July 1, 2015, SASS and A Safe Place have officially and legally merged into one organization whose mission is to prevent sexual assualt and domestic violence and to empower women. men, youth and families to heal from abuse and rebulid their lives. During fiscal year 2015 (July 2015 - June 2016), Haven provided services to 23 Durham residents including crisis counseling. safety planning, support groups, police, hospital and court accompaniments and information referrals.

Ready Rides is a non-profit organized in 2013 to provide rides to medical appointments for seniors and the physically challenged in Barrington, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford. In January of 2014 the Board voted to include the communities of Durham, Lee, Madbury and Newmarket. The rides are provided by volunteers who have gone through a vetting process. There is no charge for the rides. Ready Rides is requesting \$1,500 from each of the communities it serves. This will be supplemented by fund-raising, grants and in-kind donations from volunteer drivers, board members and participating faith communities. This money will be used for volunteer driver mileage reimbursement, a coordinator and costs associated with the program including a phone line, insurance and mailings.

From October 1, 2015 through August 17, 2016 Ready Rides has provided 666 rides to 55 registered riders. This has increased from 431 rides to 28 registered riders the past year.
