Re: FY2026 Proposed Parks & Recreation Budget

I am pleased to provide the proposed FY2026 Parks & Recreation Department budget for your consideration and support. Durham citizens, Town Administrator Selig, and the Town Council continue to offer great support for the Parks & Recreation annual budget request. This support is appreciated and has allowed the department to be creative with planning and organizing a variety of program opportunities for youth, teens, and adults in our community. The support has also been instrumental in the expansion of current programs and camps, along with development of new community events that bring people together downtown, on our trails and to our recreation facilities and park spaces.

The Parks & Recreation Department FY2026 proposed budget is an overall decrease of 2.8% from FY2025. Outlined below are the key accounts and details that support this decrease while also highlighting the added request of funds in the Capital Recreation line.

- <u>Contracted Services</u>: This budget line has been adjusted to reflect one less contracted summer camp along with amended after school program enrollment numbers that we are anticipating in 2026.
- *Professional and Staff Development:* DPR full time staff attended the National Parks & Recreation Conference in 2025. Staff is not requesting to attend this conference in 2026; therefore, this budget line has been reduced.
- <u>Vehicle Maintenance</u>: The P&R van does not require any significant maintenance items to be performed in 2026.
- <u>Recreation- Capital:</u> Funds have been requested in this budget line to purchase playground/park products and materials to keep Jackson's Landing and Woodridge Park safe, updated and maintained throughout the year as needed.

This proposed budget will be acceptable for the Parks & Recreation Department to accomplish department goals with a focus on the adopted Council Goal (#5) to pursue long-term social resiliency and quality of life in Durham intended to strengthen the community in a welcoming and inclusive manner. In 2026 the department will continue to work closely with the Parks & Recreation Committee to outline future park improvements and develop an annual and long-term maintenance plan for Jackson's Landing and Woodridge Park. The recently finalized Parks & Playground Community Needs Assessment that was completed by UNH Applied Recreation Research Collaborative (ARRC) will help guide our decision making and planning efforts. In 2026 we will continue to host a variety of events throughout the year that take place downtown and brings the community together, while also highlighting our local businesses. Durham P&R will focus on adding new summer camp opportunities and expand our REACH summer camp program to meet the enrollment demands. We will continue to support the Churchill Rink Manager with efforts to make facility improvements and plans for future renovations. Lastly, Durham Parks & Recreation recognizes the value and importance of the positive relationships and partnerships that have been built between UNH, various community organizations and businesses, town departments and ORCSD. We will continue to foster these relationships to enrich this dynamic department to provide quality programs and events for the community throughout the year.

We appreciate the support our residents offer, as it aligns with our commitment to provide a wide range of quality programs, parks, and facilities that encourage community members to participate in healthy, fun, and educational activities and events. With your support, we can continue to celebrate the essential role public recreation plays in fostering a cohesive and vibrant community. The benefits of recreation are endless!
