These funds will be used for Twenty-One Senses to provide a sensory space and calm room at the three Durham Parks and Recreation community events in 2026; Durham Day, Downtown Trick or Treat and Frost Fest. A sensory space is provided outside at the event and includes multiple sensory based activities, including a mini trampoline, rocking horses and rice table. The calm room is provided in partnership with a downtown business who donates their space. The calm room is indoors and provides a haven to step away from the crowds, noises and smells that are often associated with these events. The activities inside the space are rooted in neuroscience to help re-regulate an individuals nervous system, such as swinging, chess, rocking chairs and small spaces. Our sensory space and calm room service is \$625/event. Covering the three events listed equals \$1,875.
