Recently over 50 Durham and Newington residents presented articulate and passionate speeches before the NH Site Evaluation Committee at Pease Tradeport concerning the negative impacts to their towns and the Great Bay Estuary from Eversource's high voltage transmission lines from Madbury to Portsmouth. As you know, DHA is an intervenor, along with Durham, UNH, Newington and others in the SEC process. Under questioning by Eversource's attorneys on October 17, Janet Mackie and Nancy Sandberg will be defending Durham's historic resources lying in the path of Eversource's heavy construction equipment. Secrets of the Israel Demeritt House: Sunday, October 21 at 1 PM. Revelations about this architectural and historic gem will be presented by Arron Sturgis, President of Preservation Timber Framing. After careful documentation and deconstruction this superb federal period farmhouse is for sale to be built on your property.

Unearthing the Clues to the Burnham Garrison: Saturday, January 26 at 1 PM. Archeologist Dr. Meghan Howie, Chair, UNH Anthropology Dept., will share discoveries from the recent survey of the garrison site. The Burnham Garrison survived the 1694 Oyster River Massacre.
