Oyster River Forest Trails Initiative

A project of the Oyster River Trails Working Group, an ad-hoc group of volunteers working to fund trail improvements at the Oyster River Forest in Durham, New Hampshire.

Vision To improve recreational trails at the Oyster River Forest conservation area through comprehensive trail upgrades, to be implemented in 2016.

The Plan Working from a trails plan developed by Ibis Consulting for the Durham Conservation Commission and the Durham Land Stewardship Committee, the town has solicited a proposal from the Appalachian Mountain Club for a comprehensive trails upgrade plan which will:

- Upgrade surfaces of 1.8 miles of trail through the Oyster River Forest, connecting Packer's Falls Road and UNH's College Woods for hiking, mountain biking, and cross-country skiing.
- Construct .8 miles of handicapped-accessible (ADA) trail connecting Packer's Falls Road, Emeritis neighborhood, and Spruce Hole Bog.
- Improve a 1-mile circuit trail around Spruce Hole Bog (hiking only).
- Construct of a wood bridge over Oyster River tributary providing access for mowing equipment and for mountain bikes, pedestrians, and skiers during all seasons.
- A Protect water quality in the Oyster River though improved stream crossings along all trails.
- M Improve signage, trail blazing, and maps of entire trail system and at kiosks.
- Create a new connection between the Oyster River Forest and UNH trails at College Woods, creating a connected, off-road corridor from downtown Durham to Packer's Falls Road.


