

CONSERVATION LANDS
SOUTHEAST LAND TRUST OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

SELT does not currently own any land in Durham (but that will change with the pending Gsottschneider conservation project). SELT does hold several conservation easements in Town or Executory Interests in Durham:

Conservation Easements held by SELT:

1. Harriman Conservation Easement (former Bedard Farm): 108-acres
2. Mill Pond Center Easement: 10-acres
3. Meadows & MacDonald Conservation Easement: 8-acres
4. Gangwer-Roselawn Farm #1 Conservation Easement: 48-acres (partially in Madbury)
5. Gangwer-Roselawn Farm #2 Conservation Easement: 20-acres
6. Straus Conservation Easement: 18-acres (partially in Madbury)
7. Joe Ford Wildlife Sanctuary Conservation Easement: 71-acres (mostly in Lee, but small portion in Durham)
8. Amber Acres Conservation Easement (now part of Tecce Farm): 39-acres
9. Thompson Forest Conservation Easement (shown as Town of Durham #1): 54-acres
10. Pike Conservation Easement: 36-acres
11. Dunham Conservation Easement: 50-acres (partially in Lee)
12. Burrows Conservation Easement: 28-acres

Executory Interest in Conservation Easements held by Other Organizations (shown as Little John Drive common open space)

1. Allan Farm #1 Conservation Easement held by Strafford County Conservation District: 3-acres
2. Allan Farm #2 Conservation Easement held by Strafford County Conservation District: 41-acres
3. Allan Farm #3 Conservation Easement held by Strafford County Conservation District: 30-acres
