Bulky Waste Pickup starts May 1st.

The recycling market is showing an increase, now at \$74/ton. Other markets are at approx.: comingle at \$120/ton, household waste at \$81/ton, and cardboard at \$35/ton. These \$\$'s are all costs to the town. Review of Sam's and Carden's diversion/waste chart – really great visuals and to learn from the data.

Compost Bins – Have received 3 bin orders so far. 20 bins are needed for a town order. The Bin order deadline has been extended to April 24th.

Earth Day Update - Sally ran down her list.

Update on: setup, businesses and ORHS participation, pamphlets and various poster printing, committee members to bring, for display, household non-packaged products they have, sandwich boards, DPW compost/recycle event containers and discussed how to monitor the sorting, Jim L has access to tables, stickers, clothesline, UNH representatives.

Nell looking for feedback and agreement on how much time should be spent on each area of focus of the educational campaign; recycle right, compost, repurpose.... It was suggested that 6 months be the amount of time for sharing/educating each focus area of the campaign. Banners and posters will be made for supporting each focus area.
