Several projects have been postponed, including Young Drive, 2 Brook Way, and Mill Plaza.

XIV. Zoning Ordinance – General Amendments. Numerous miscellaneous amendments are being proposed to the Zoning Ordinance based upon earlier discussions by the Planning Board, issues that have been raised in recent years, and a review of the ordinance by the Town Planner. <u>Recommended action</u>: Complete initial review.

We can probably finish the board's review of the initial draft. We have made it to Section 175-107 Conservation Subdivisions, Subsection D.

## XV. Other Business:

• Designate Planning Board representative to Addressing Committee

See the enclosed documents. The Town Council has approved the creation of an Addressing Committee to deal with issues and policies related to street names and addresses. Corey Landry, Fire Chief, will chair the committee. The Town Council included one Planning Board representative on the committee.

The committee will probably meet about once each month for a year or more. We will find a time that is convenient for the members, which will likely be during business hours as there will be several staff members on the committee.

• Designate Planning Board representative to Integrated Waste Management Advisory Committee

Andrew Corrow brought this up at the last Planning Board meeting. Andrew and I met with Nell Neal, chair of the Integrated Waste Management Committee, and Carden Welsh, a former committee member, and Doug Bullen, Public Works staff, to discuss strategies for achieving a higher level of recycling for student housing developments and other projects. While there is no official slot for a Planning Board representative, Nell would welcome additional participation. The committee meets about once each month at 7:00 am but might be able to change the time to accommodate new members. Given the high priority for recycling in Durham it would be great if a board member were interested in serving on the committee.
