I'm sorry (again) for not getting back to you sooner. Thank you for checking the site for marsh elder. I would agree that the salt marsh community is nonexistent, and the wrack-line zone sometimes occupied by the marsh elder is pretty minimal here. With the high, eroded banks, there just isn't much available habitat at this site. Since there is no marsh elder (*Iva frutescens*) within the project area, I have no further concerns.
