Small ruminants (sheep and goats) can graze under solar arrays. So solar arrays and that form of animal agriculture can coexist. (Less likely cattle, although Dexters, which are small, and other small breeds, might work. I would not recommend pig grazing near or under the arrays, since they could destabilize the units.) This is done in numbers of places around the U.S. and elsewhere, for trackers as well as stable arrays. As for till agriculture, solar arrays should obviously avoid the better agricultural soils. We don't want to remove those good soils from the potential of food production. For legal purposes, we can use existing state agricultural soil definitions and put those into the zoning ordinance.
