Would you please send the following message to members of the HDC.

Dear HDC members,

Thank you for voting unanimously to hold a public hearing on the Red Tower entrance for January 7th and for a site walk on Dec. 10th at 1pm.

I listened to the entire HDC Mtg. last evening, but when Larry Woods acting as Chair asked for any comments from the public on the 19 Main Street application, I found I was unable to speak up as my computer screen read that the host was not allowing it. I had not written down the phone number to call, so it was pretty frustrating.

If I had been able to speak with you I would have said that a single entrance between these two historic properties would be much more in keeping with traditional access approaches to 18th and 19th century homes in the HD. I agree completely with Charlotte Hitchcock, the architect on your board that a single entry allows for the lane widths to decrease and the side yards to increase. This would significantly improve the public view of the historic properties by giving them a wider base on which to appreciate their architectural features.

Over all, I am concerned that the parking pressures stemming from the Mill Plaza development threaten the Historic District. The HD should not be sacrificed to meet the needs of the Central Business District.
