Dear Planning Board,

I have two concerns or questions regarding the proposed landscape plan at the 19-21 Main Street "Toomerfs" property (revised February 3, 2022) currently in design review with the Planning Board.

- 1) The slope at the Chesley Drive end of the parking lot is shown as 2:1 (50%), which is quite steep. I can find no information regarding treatment of this slope. Is the surface of this slope to be left as fill (sand, gravel, or stone riprap)? This would be a "quick and dirty" solution, and, to use a technical term, butt ugly. I would hope for a more natural and aesthetically pleasing treatment, and one that is suggestive of the forest being destroyed. I believe the proposed slope is too steep to be planted successfully, which seems an elemental design flaw.
- 2) The proposed planting plan is extremely thin and lacking with regard to vegetation, aesthetics, sustainable practice, and restoration of the woodland being destroyed. I would hope the Planning Board would request a significant expansion of vegetation across the site, including within the parking area.
