UNH students from the UNH Sustainability Capstone Group have been working with the Integrated Waste Management Advisory Committee (IWMAC) to create a composting challenge for Town Councilors and town employees who live in Durham. The students will be at the meeting on Monday night to present their proposal.

Goals:

- Engage town workers to set an example for Durham residents
- Reduce waste in Durham
- Explore benefits of town-wide composting & possible barriers

Why Compost?

- Reduces waste going to landfills → reduces greenhouse gases being emitted & land needed for this waste
- Recycles organic materials into nutrient-rich soil for plants

Project Plan & Timeline:

- Challenge will start on October 4th & end on November 15th
- Town council & town hall employees, who are Durham residents, will sign up online → receive compost bags & bin and full guidance & support throughout the challenge
 - There will be a \$10 refundable fee if participants complete the six week challenge
- Participants will have the option to bring compost to transfer station or backyard compost
- Participants will weigh their compost & solid waste at the transfer station or at home each week, report it, and offer their feedback
- Weekly data updates will be provided for participants to see progress
- When the challenge is completed presentations will be made to the Town Council and IWMAC with feedback, results, and next steps
